It provides an indepth look at key roles which HR plays in large companies.











OTHER PROJECTS:

AmCham supports very intensely its member companies which organize projects related to education. In 2012, we successfully organized QSI Career Day for QSI International and a Field Trip for City University of Seattle. Also, for many years AmCham members have been actively involved in the Advisory Committee on Education Law, and Law on Vocational Education. In 2009, seven out of nine AmCham comments were incorporated into the Education Law.

Committee members still regularly provide comments on the Higher Education Act, Law on Vocational Education and other legislation. AmCham has continually supported various Slovak governments in promoting research and development and innovation. For instance, AmCHam organized "Innovation Policy and Technology Transfer" Conference in 2010 and "Innovation Imperative: Slovakia's Future" Conference in 2013.

Each year AmCham hosts a Business Lunch with academia and industry representatives as part of ICETA conference to discuss current issues in the Business-Academic cooperation. AmCham supports eSkills Week – an EU campaign to raise awareness of job opportunities in the field of ICT.
