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Transfer Pricing Update

Advice related to transfer pricing has been the topic of several business breakfasts over the past year. The legal regulation in this field is developing rapidly and the number of tax inspections, performed by specialized investigators, is increasing. The new Base Erosion and Profit Shifting (BEPS package), recently released by the OECD, may be considered as the biggest shakeup in international tax rules in a generation. Slovak companies are engaged in transactions with related parties are increasingly exposed to significant tax risks if they do not manage their transfer pricing policy or lack professionally-prepared local transfer price documentation.

Experts from IB Grant Thornton provided the participants with the latest updates regarding transfer pricing rules and the related new legislation and changes through practical examples, concrete advice and best practice scenarios.
